A MESSAGE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR RADM ANDY LENNON, USN (RETIRED)

It's easy to feel confident when things are going well. But what do you do when everything is going wrong?

Sir Ernest Shackleton became one of the most well-known mariners in the 20th century not by succeeding, but by failing. While leading an expedition to Antarctica, his ship famously became stuck in the ice pack and eventually sank. Stranded in one of the world's most inhospitable environments with no means of summoning help, Shackleton led his crew through unimaginable circumstances and against all odds, eventually securing their rescue. Not one crew member perished during the entire twenty-four months they were marooned on Elephant Island.

The explorers relied on two traits, which you as Sea Cadets must also rely on: perseverance and teamwork. Instead of avoiding hardship, are you willing to embrace it? By making the best of a bad situation, Shackleton set himself on a course to make history. However, Shackleton couldn't succeed by himself. His shipmates were equally important contributors, and he valued them immensely. They probably had their share of disagreements, and they might not have even liked each other; but by working together, they all survived and made it back home.

While I hope that no Sea Cadet will ever be marooned in Antarctica, I know you all will encounter difficulties. By relying on perseverance and teamwork, you can see your way through them. Who knows? You might just make history.



In some instances, cadets embark on Navy ships, sleep aboard, and sail to a different port. Fleet Week strengthens the connection between the Navy and the public while offering cadets unforgettable shipboard experiences.




CHART YOUR COURSE

If you've seen the movie Top Gun, you're already familiar with the Navy's impressive aviation capabilities! For cadets with dreams of becoming pilots or working in aviation, Sea Cadets offers incredible training opportunities such as FAA Ground School, drone training, airman training, aircraft maintenance, and the National Flight Academy.

Fun fact: The U.S. Navy has produced the most astronauts out of the U.S. military branches, followed by the U.S. Air Force. The United States Naval Academy has also produced the most astronauts of any college, with 54 alums who have become astronauts. Cadets interested in careers in space exploration can pursue these unique opportunities:



BEYOND THE HORIZON: SPACE AND AVIATION ADVENTURES

Aviation - Space and Logistics (Wallops Island, VA):

Held at NASA's Wallops Flight Facility, this training introduces cadets to space and aviation logistics. Cadets learn from rocket trajectory, telemetry, and engineering experts, work in the education center, and build and test-launch model rockets on-site. They also connect with the Navy's on-site Surface Warfare team and explore NASA's engineering shops to gain insight into space and aviation career paths. Located on a waterfront campus, this training provides hands-on learning and opportunities to relax and enjoy the scenic environment.

Space Camp (Huntsville, AL):



Trades and Technical Skills:

Cadets gain hands-on experience in shipbuilding, Military Sealift Command, Seabee training (construction, welding, etc.), vehicle maintenance, and culinary arts.

Medical Training:

From beginner courses to advanced certifications, cadets can explore EMT services, wilderness rescue, and even aerospace medicine.

Special Operations:

Starting with field operations, cadets can progress to ropes rescue, wilderness survival, and advanced naval warfare/intro to SEAL training.

Leadership Development:

Cadets can also apply to attend Federal Military Academy Summer Seminar Trainings for further leadership insight.

Public safety trainings include Master-At-Arms, JAG, Homeland Security, and U.S. Coast Guard Maritime Interdiction training.

Ceremonial and Music Programs:

Cadets can train as part of a ceremonial or honor quard or participate in band and music training.

Every cadet's journey begins with foundational programs such as Navy League Orientation (for grades 5-8) or Sea Cadet Recruit Training (for high school-aged cadets).

The Sea Cadets' land-based training will inspire, challenge, and prepare cadets for success in their military, civilian careers, or as community leaders.


